1. 2020 UCGIS Research Award

The UCGIS Research Award Review Committee for 2021 was comprised of the committee chair, Michael Leitner (Louisiana State University), and committee members Kate Beard-Tisdale (University of Maine), Yingjie Hu (University at Buffalo, SUNY), and André Skupin (San Diego State University). The Committee selected Dr. Brian Berry, the Lloyd Viel Berkner Regental Professor in the School of Economic, Political and Policy Sciences at the University of Texas at Dallas, to receive 2021 UCGIS Research Award. This award recognizes Berry's groundbreaking spatial analysis work in methodological and theoretical GIScience developments over many decades, epitomized by his fundamental and innovative contribution of the geographic matrix to GIS. Berry's achievements in spatial analysis, with an early emphasis on the regional sciences, have been transformative to our discipline.
