

Visiting Assistant Professor in Geography Job Announcement, The University of Texas at Dallas

The Department of Geospatial Information Sciences at the University of Texas at Dallas invites applications for a full-time non-tenure-track **Visiting Assistant Professor** in Geography, with a specialization in Human Geography. The candidate will be demonstrably committed to outstanding teaching at the undergraduate level, with the expectation of incorporating GIS and remote sensing into teaching. The teaching load is four classes during the fall and spring semesters for a total of 8 classes annually, including but not limited to: An Introduction to World Geographic Regions, Human Migration and Mobility, Population and Development, Urban Growth and Structure, Urban Planning and Policy, Spatial Dimensions of Health and Disease, and The Global Economy. The position is a nine-month appointment with an opportunity to teach in the summer depending on needs. The successful candidate will be involved in curriculum development, supervision of teaching assistants, and collaboration with other faculty members. The initial two-year appointment will begin in Fall 2021 and is renewable with the opportunity for promotion.

A Ph.D. in Geography or closely related field at the time of appointment is preferred, but ABD Ph.D. candidates will also be considered. To apply, please submit a cover letter explaining your teaching philosophy and experience, and fit with the position (max two pages), a curriculum vitae identifying areas of specialization and competence along with the contact information for three professional references, an electronic copy of transcripts, and other supporting materials (such as teaching records and student evaluations) to Chair of the Search Committee, Dr. Fang Qiu at ffqiu@utdallas.edu. Inquiries about the position may also be addressed to the chair of the committee. Review of applications will begin immediately and continue until the position is filled.
